

Albany Township Minutes  
February 14, 2017

The Town Board met at the Town Hall with all members present. The Pledge of Allegiance was shared. A moment of silence was held for Dave Dowden's passing. Proof of posting verified in three places, published and on the internet. Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer reported \$661,289.27 in Checking; \$124,622.35 in Savings; \$73,633.26 in the Building Fund; \$20,027.66 in the Machinery Fund; and \$10,018.23 in the Reassessment Fund. Discussion was held regarding having a purchase order or some other form of paying for large purchases. She will look into it and report back at the next meeting. A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Schultz to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Roads and Driveway Permits: Krupke reported that we had gotten more salt and chips and that should be sufficient unless we get a large amount of snow. Trees have been trimmed on English Settlement Rd. and three dead trees cut down on Atkinson Rd. Someone took care of cutting up and hauling the wood. The County Clerk contacted the owner of the old Maple Leaf Cheese factory about several vehicles there. His call was not answered. He will contact the owner again. The edges of Brooklyn-Albany Rd at the end of Attica Rd are breaking up and need to be fixed. It is on the Brooklyn part of the road. Someone will contact the patrolman to see about fixing it.

Assessor: One small permit.

Insurance: No report.

Library: Roald Henderson is replacing Louise Spring on the Board. Things are going well.

Recycling: A Green County Landfill meeting was held at the Justice Center regarding changing the way of billing so that it is easier for municipalities to budget. All municipalities must be in agreement for the change to be made.

Other Business: A Fire Department meeting was held to discuss budgeting, attracting new members, etc. Green County municipalities are requesting the County to look into better broadband coverage. A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Schultz to approve a resolution to pursue better broadband coverage in our area. Motion carried 3-0. Schultz attended the Wisconsin Towns Assn. district meeting and gave a report on weight limits. We have a Class B limit posted all year long and that is good. Spangler attended a Law Enforcement Round Table meeting. A primary election will be held on

February 21 for State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The next regular Board meeting will be March 14.

Payment of Bills: A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Schultz to approve the bills as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Schultz to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 3-0.
